Curricula for Legacy Three-Year-Old Program

Benchmarks

Bible

- ♦ Students are introduced to *Bible* characters and scripture in daily *Bible* lessons
- ♦ Students learn a *Bible* verse with each *Bible* lesson
- ♦ Students will have daily prayer time
- ♦ Students will learn about Jesus through classroom units which are taught with a biblical worldview

Pledges

- ♦ Students will recite pledges to the American Flag, Oklahoma State Flag, the Christian Flag, and to the *Bible*

Handwriting

- ♦ Students will hold writing utensils correctly
- ♦ Students will utilize regular sized crayons, not jumbo, or Pipsqueak markers
- ♦ Students will use workbooks for their lessons, and other crafts and activities to engage students in learning
- ♦ Students will begin first semester with tracing their names, and will move to writing their names second semester; demonstrating proper use of capital letters for the first letter, followed by lower-case

Fine Motor Skills

- ♦ Students will develop fine motor skills necessary to utilize a writing utensil correctly
- ♦ Students will strengthen muscles utilized in tearing paper
- ♦ Students will develop safety practices for correct scissor usage
- ♦ Students will cut straight lines, curves, and zig zags

Gross Motor Skills

- ♦ Students will receive recess time each day to build core strength through climbing, running, and jumping

Language Development

- ♦ Students will learn to recognize their names
- ♦ Students will begin learning the letters of the alphabet, and letter sounds
- ♦ Students will sharpen their listening and comprehension skills as books are read orally to the class
- ♦ Students will increase their vocabulary through daily circle time, group interaction, and learning stations.

Mathematic Development

- ♦ Students will begin learning numbers 1-30
- ♦ Students will count out loud 1-30

Color Recognition

Students will learn one color per month:

- ♦ Red
- ♦ Orange
- ♦ Brown
- ♦ Green
- ♦ Black/White
- ♦ Pink
- ♦ Blue
- ♦ Yellow
- ♦ Purple

Shape Identification

Students will learn and identify one shape per month:

- ♦ Square
- ♦ Rectangle
- ♦ Triangle
- ♦ Star
- ♦ Circle
- ♦ Heart
- ♦ Oval
- ♦ Diamond
- ♦ Shape Review

Social Development

- ♦ Students will learn the Legacy Triad: Kind Words, Gentle Touch, and Smile
- ♦ Students will interact with one another and play with classmates
- ♦ Students will utilize appropriate social behavior
- ♦ Students will clean up after themselves
- ♦ Students will respect and obey the teachers

- ♦ Students will begin learning responsibility

Pledges

- ♦ Students will recite pledges to the American Flag, Oklahoma State Flag, the Christian Flag, and to the *Bible*

Handwriting

- ♦ Students will hold writing utensils correctly
- ♦ Students will use workbooks for their lessons
- ♦ Students will write their names correctly, utilizing capital letters appropriately

Fine Motor Skills

- ♦ Students will demonstrate fine motor skills necessary to utilize a writing utensil correctly
- ♦ Students will develop safety practices for correct scissor usage
- ♦ Students will cut straight lines, curves, and zig zags

Gross Motor Skills

- ♦ Students will throw, run, jump, catch, and hop on one foot to build strength, as well as to develop correct technique

Language Development

- ♦ Students will recognize their names
- ♦ Students will recognize sight words
- ♦ Students will develop recall and comprehension skills as books are read orally to the class
- ♦ Students will increase their vocabulary through daily circle time and group interaction
- ♦ Students will identify rhyming sounds
- ♦ Students will categorize initial word sounds
- ♦ Students will use segmenting to classify individual words in sentences

Mathematic Development

- ♦ Students will learn numbers 1-30
- ♦ Students will visually recognize numbers 1-30
- ♦ Students will count out loud 1-30

Color Recognition

- ♦ Students will identify colors
- ♦ Students will sort items into color groups

- ♦ Students will learn the following colors: red, green, blue, purple, brown, black, white, orange, yellow, and pink

Shape Identification

- ♦ Students will recognize shapes
- ♦ Students will determine size and shape of objects
- ♦ Students will learn the following shapes: circle, square, oval, triangle, rectangle, diamond, heart, and star

Social Development

- ♦ Students will learn the Legacy Triad: Kind Words, Gentle Touch, and Smile
- ♦ Students will interact with one another and play with classmates
- ♦ Students will utilize appropriate social behavior
